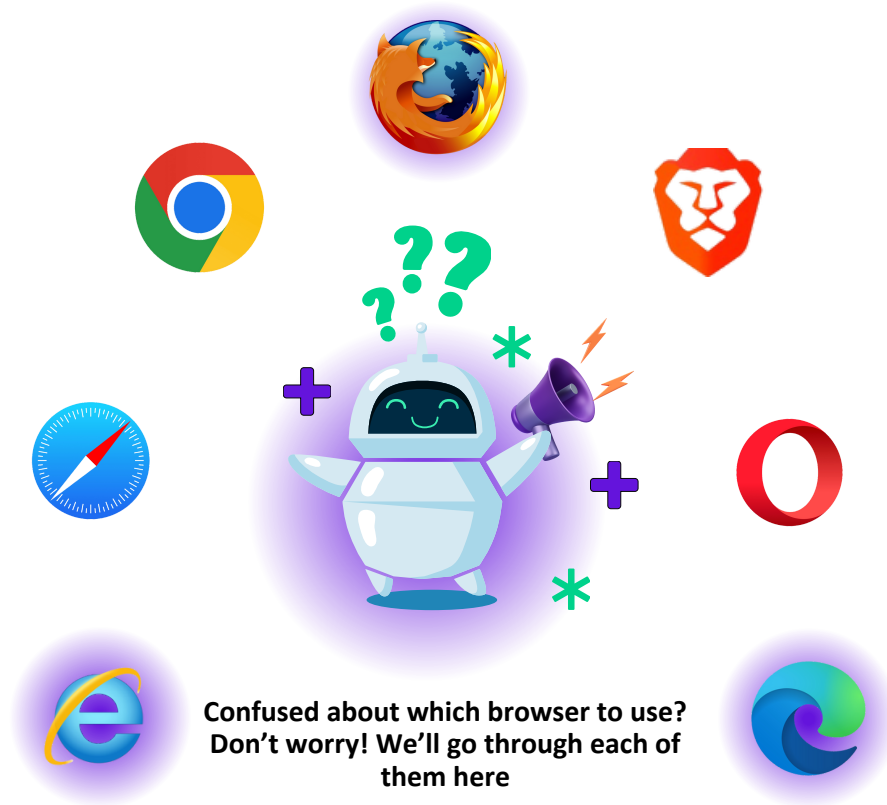


Internet Browsers - Information Sheet



Confused about which browser to use? Don't worry! We'll go through each of them here

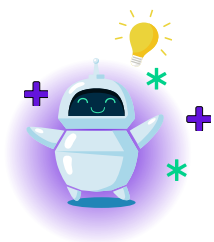

With this in mind, Internet Explorer is still widely used and includes several security features.



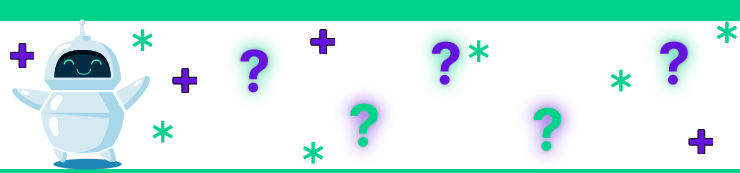

Google Chrome is one of the most popular browsers.



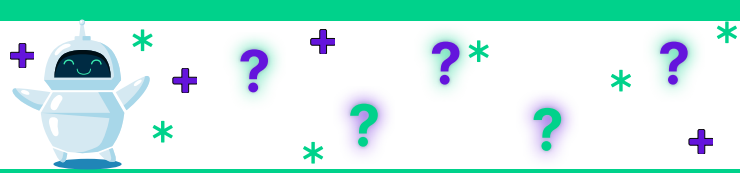

Brave isn't a well known browser but has over 15.5 million users worldwide.



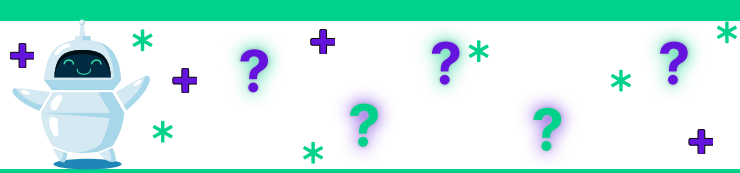

- Design feels quite cluttered

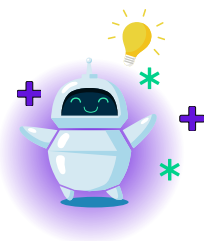
